Welcome to the Busy Bees Room! We have put this packet of information together for you to tell you a little about our classroom expectations and curriculum. Our toddler classroom consists of children ages 26 months - 3yrs. Our classroom is set up in learning centers. These centers are designed for your toddler to have the opportunity to have hands-on learning at their own rate and interest. We have found that a toddler's best learning motivation is their own exploration. We use thematic units to interconnect the learning that is done in the classroom centers to the learning that takes place through organized activities. Our goal in this room is to also start encouraging self-help skills, develop better communication skills, improve motor development, and to build on their cognitive development.

We feel honored and excited to be working with your child and are excited of the opportunity to discover your child's unique personality, strengths and their challenges. If you ever, for any reason, have a question or concern regarding your child, please do not hesitate to talk to us. We also look forward to getting to know your entire family as we partner with you in the process of nurturing your child's growth and development.

General Little Victories Information

- 1. Extra Clothes:** Kids are kids and the best way to be a kid is to just get in there and explore things! Please dress your child in clothes that are meant to get dirty. We will *never* exclude a child from an activity because they may get dirty and you can expect to see some really good stains coming home! We like to do messy, wet, and creative activities during art, science and outdoor play and ask that you ***have at least one complete set of clothes at school*** to change into in case we get a little too messy, wet or creative. This consists of underwear, socks, pants/shorts and a shirt.
- 2. Summertime Reminders:** Due to state licensing guidelines, we are only allowed to apply sun block to children who have provided their own from home. Please bring a bottle of *sun block* to keep at school. We also would like to have children wear *sturdy shoes* that allow for safe running, climbing and riding. Flip-flops do not provide adequate support for young feet and make it extremely difficult to run and climb. Sandals that buckle and tennis shoes are much better for young children and as an added bonus, will keep those feet much more clean!!
- 3. Wintertime Reminders:** During the colder months, we enjoy exploring outside and enjoying all that the snow has to offer! If the temperature is above 10° with wind chill, we will adhere to

our outside schedule times. Please make sure to bring boots, snow pants, mittens (not knit as they get wet) and hats. Because many children have similar clothing, we ask that you **PLEASE LABEL ALL OUTDOOR CLOTHING.**

Busy Bee Information

1. **Naptime Blanket:** Having a blanket and a small stuffed animal to snuggle with makes children feel more relaxed and calm, which means that they can fall asleep more easily. Blankets should be able to fit inside your child's backpack and cubby. We also ask that blankets be taken home on your last day of the week for washing and returned to school when your child next attends. This helps us all stay healthy!
2. **Potty Training:** Many of our children are either beginning to potty train, in the process or newly potty trained. We know this is an exciting mile stone for children and we will work with you to help your child accomplish this. During the training period we will work with you to ensure that we are using the same methods and rewards that you are using at home which will allow things to go smoothly and much more efficiently. We also ask that you bring extra clothes during this time as we understand accidents do happen. Once your child is fully potty trained and developmentally ready, they will transition into our Preschool room (minimum age is 33 months).
3. **Art:** We have art everyday in our classroom. Typically when we create a project we love to display the work on our walls for a week or so. After that we will place your child's art work in their folder or cubby which is located just inside our classroom door. Children create these with great pride and we want to share that with you.
4. **Curriculum and How Children Learn:** As is stated in Little Victories curriculum overview statement: *Little Victories uses Developmentally Appropriate Practices set by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) in developing their theme based curriculum. Our Lead Staff ensures that your child will be given the opportunity to learn and grow using all of their five developmental areas: Physical, Emotional, Cognitive, Social and Creative.* We develop our thematic curriculum based on seasonal themes and the interests of the children. While we create a lesson plan each week, we are also acutely in-tuned with the teachable moments and remain flexible and open to change. We share the philosophy that young children learn best through Play as is supported in extensive research. If you have any questions regarding curriculum and learning, we encourage you to speak with us and to check out the NAEYC website at naeyc.org.
5. **Daily Communication:** We believe that frequent communication with families is essential to the success of a child's educational experience. Children that are in attendance over 3 hours per day will receive a daily communication sheet that will give you all sorts of information on their day. We have a copy attached in this handbook for your review. Families that attend less than 3 hours per day may also receive a communication sheet upon request.
